Scouts BSA - April 28th ~ 30th Check in beginning at 7:00 pm on the 28th and will continue Saturday at 9am.

Adult Scouter: \$20 per person *(includes Saturday evening meal)*

Cub Scouts: \$25.00 per person includes Saturday lunch *(hot dogs, chips, cookies & drink)* and dinner, plus the Saturday Cub Program.

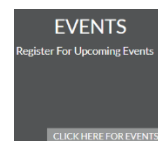
Family members: \$10.00 per person for those arriving later in the day for Saturday 6pm meal only

Host troop is **Troop 4**. They will be camping in Site 4 and will be responsible for flag raising and lowering on Saturday, as well as coordinating the Saturday evening campfire.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP: Go 2 miles east of Wilmot on SD Hwy 15, turn left and go 5 miles north on black top, see the Camp Iyatata sign and turn right and drive 3 miles east (*this road is gravel*).

PARKING: Due to the large number of participants this year, we only want to see one vehicle per campsite. Others can park at the top of the hill by the gate.

NOTE: Be Prepared and bring along your water bottle, rain gear and insect repellent with deet.

Spring Camporee: This year's Scouts BSA portion will feature Emergency Preparedness and Fingerprinting MB in the morning. Location: Program Shelter. Cub Scouts will be enjoying BB Gun, Archery and Sling Shots. Location: South of the program shelter. **All Districts are invited to attend.**

Kilts: Scouts BSA youth, Adults and Cub Scouts are asked to make or buy kilts. They can be purchased on Amazon or another site called Ali Express.

Homework for Scouts BSA: One of the stations for the Highland Games in the afternoon is for the Troops to do a **Scottish Dance**. They will be judged, so that means you will need to practice before the Rendezvous. You can come up with your own dance by searching online for Scottish Dancers in Kilts.

Webelos Crossover Ceremony: 4:30 pm, Saturday, (meet at flags). This annual ceremony involves crossing-over a real rope bridge, symbolizing the crossing over from Cub Scouts to Scouts BSA, guided by adult leaders.

Recognition Dinner: 6:00 pm on Saturday in the program shelter. Guest Speaker and the annual awards ceremony will take place after dinner in the program shelter. Awards will be presented to adults in Arrowhead District. Make sure you nominate those you feel should be awarded for their hard work. Nomination voting will be available online on the registration page. (MV and RR are welcome to present their awards if they choose to do so)

Campfire: Following the closing flag ceremony on Saturday, April 29th, everyone is invited to the Spring Rendezvous Campfire and Order of the Arrow Call-out at the Campfire Bowl. Everyone is asked to meet at the main flagpole at 8:15 pm for the retiring of the colors.



CONCESSION STAND: The Rolling Hills Chapter of the Order of the Arrow will be running a concession stand in the garage, which will be open periodically during the weekend. Items sold may include Caps, T-shirts, Patches, Candy, Popcorn & Pop. Proceeds for the concession stand go to fund various chapter activities.

FIRST AID: A first aid station will be located in the garage.

FRIDAY – April 28th

- 7:00 pm Registration in the Lodge.
- 9:00 pm Cracker Barrel in the Lodge for Adult Leaders and Senior Patrol Leaders
- 11:00 pm Lights out...Quiet Time

SATURDAY – April 29th

- 6:30 am Rise and shine, breakfast in your campsite. Webelos eat with their Troops.
- 9:00 am Flag ceremony and announcements on parade ground
- 9:00 am Registration opens in garage. Pre-register online or pay at camp (one unit/check please)
- 9:15 am Scouts BSA begin Emergency Preparedness MB at Program shelter. Fingerprinting MB in the Lodge.
- 10:30 am Cub Scouts – BB Gun, Archery and Slingshot begin south of the Program Shelter.
- 12 noon Lunch – eat at your campsites. Cub Scouts will roast a hot dog over a campfire at the program shelter.
- 1:15 pm **All Scouts:** Highland Games begin. Meet at the water hydrant lower level.
- 4:00 pm Troops turn in skits to **Site 4**, before you go to the crossover ceremony
- 4:30 pm Webelos Crossing Over Ceremony. Everyone meets on parade ground. All Scouts and Leaders please attend in Class A's.
- 6:00 pm Dinner - after the crossover is finished, please assemble on the parade ground for Grace. The meal will be served in the lodge with seating available in the program shelter.
- 7:00 pm **Guest Speaker -Scout Leader District Awards** will be presented after the meal in the program shelter.
- 7:30 pm - 8:15 Free time; OA Rolling Hills Chapter trading post open in the garage; campfire preparation, etc.
- 8:15 pm Assemble at the flagpole to retire the colors
- 8:30 pm - 9:30 Campfire to include skits and/or song, & Order of the Arrow Call-out ceremony - campfire bowl.
- 11:00 pm Lights out - Quiet time!

SUNDAY - May 1st

- 9:00 am - 9:30 Chapel Service – south end of the camp, near the lake. All units will participate in the service.
- After Chapel **Break Camp, clean-up troop sites - have a safe trip home!**

Attention all Arrowmen the Rolling Hills Chapter of the Order of the Arrow has a number of events and activities scheduled during the Spring Rendezvous that all Arrowmen should be aware of.

What is the Order Of The Arrow? It is Scouting's honor camper society and was founded in 1915. It was set up to honor those Scouts and Scouters who meet camping requirements and live the Scout Oath and Laws. The members of his troop elect each Scout and the troop committee nominates Adults. Members wear a distinctive white sash with a red arrow. Their job at the Spring Rendezvous is to answer any questions you may have and help direct you to the day's activities. They are also directing traffic in the parking area on top of the hill.

ONE - The chapter organizes and operates the snack bar at the Rendezvous as a service to Scouts, parents and guests, which raise money for some of the things the Chapter likes to do each year.

TWO - The chapter plans and conducts the Order of the Arrow Call-out ceremony as part of Saturday night's campfire, where those Scouts & Scouters who were recently elected by their troops to become members of the OA.

THREE - Arrowmen will be helping with this event by leading the Webelos to the crossing ceremony area.

FAMILY CAMPERS
